Prior to joining Recontek, Mr. Rosenbaum served as assistant vice president for Eticam, where he was responsible for environmental permitting of new facilities.

Mr. Rosenbaum is the author of *ISO 14001 and the Law*,





the first definitive text to consider the legal issues raised by the international environmental standard on companies, consultants and registrars. He teaches auditing to applicants for the ISO 14001 lead auditor certification as well as water rights and land use planning classes at the Thomas Jefferson School of Law.

Mr. Rosenbaum received his J. D. from California Western School of Law. Rutgers University awarded him a Master's degree in administration and a Bachelor's degree in mathematics and chemistry. He is a member of the California Bar and licensed by the state of California as a registered environmental assessor.
