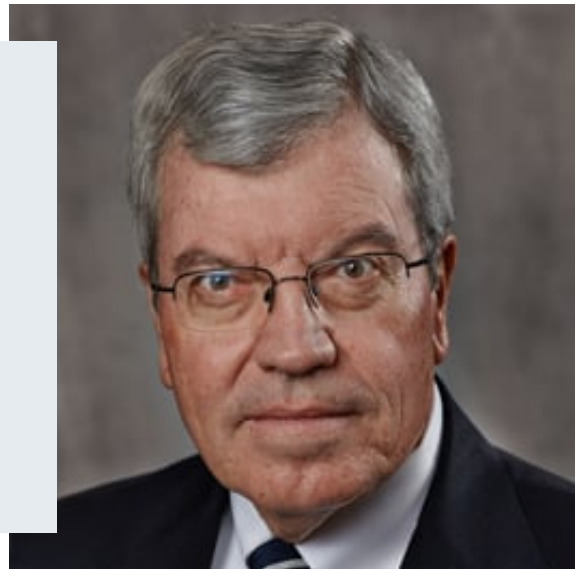


## Christopher S. Berry
