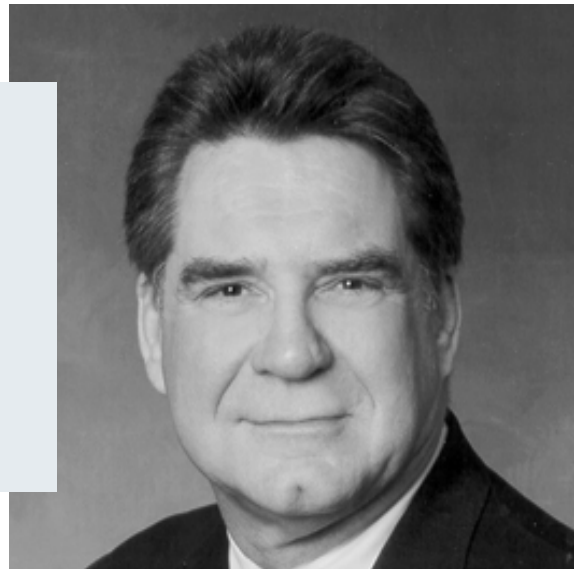


Russell J. Barron

His educational background as a historian gives him a strong foundation of oral and written skills to explain complex factual and legal issues to clients and juries. A frequent speaker and teacher at bar and business group meetings, he has been a board-member and chairperson of several committees of the Licensing Executives Society (USA/Canada), including ones which focus on the teaching of IA management, congressional liaison and reporting standards for IA information. In 1996, he was appointed an adjunct professor at the J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management at Northwestern University, where he taught courses on intellectual property strategic management for several years.

Russell is the founder of the firm's IP Best Practices (IPBP) group. He frequently wrote on IA management topics. This practice focuses on the business of intellectual assets, including IA functional aspects of business organization, licensing, IA portfolio management, IA database development, IA tax management, IA valuation and identification of licensing candidates and targets.
